Who qualifies for a TLT Scholarship?

Each spring, Oregon State Credit Union awards ten \$2,500 college scholarships to eligible high school seniors graduating from a high school within our 24 county field of membership. The TLT (Tomorrow's Leaders Today) Scholarship recognizes and encourages academic excellence and

academic excellence and community engagement among our student members.

To be eligible to apply for a TLT scholarship, applicants must be a member in good standing of Oregon State Credit Union, and they must have opened a TLT checking account prior to January 1 of their senior year of high school. They must be a graduating high school senior from one of the 24 counties within our field of membership with a minimum GPA of 2.50, and they must be planning to attend a two- or four year Oregon college or university.

Every year, Oregon State Credit Union awards scholarships to collegebound high school seniors from our 24-county membership area as part of our commitment to education. This year, 10 deserving students each received \$2,500 scholarships to attend a college or university in Oregon.

The TLT (Tomorrow's Leaders Today) Scholarship program recognizes overall excellence within our student members. Over the last 21 years, over 260 students have received more than \$285,000 in scholarships toward their college educations.
